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Thank you for your interest in the *Time's Up, Measure Up* research grantmaking program. To apply, please follow the instructions below. **In addition to completing the fillable form below**, completed applications should include the following:

- Project proposal (2,000 words and 2 graphs max; graphs do not count towards word count):
  - o Suggested research project
  - o Relevance to *Time's Up, Measure Up* mission
  - o Contribution to knowledge base on women in the COVID-19 pandemic
  - o Methodological approach, including research design and data sources
    - Applicants should clarify:
      - How their research will disaggregate data and analysis by race, gender, class, and other identity markers
      - How they plan on taking an intersectional approach in their work
  - o Timeline for completion, project milestones with specific dates, and proposed progress measures
- Budget template
- Budget narrative explaining how the funds will be used (750 words max)
- Fringe benefits policy statement
- Fiscal sponsorship letter from funding organization (if necessary)

### File conventions

The project proposal and budget narrative should be submitted as PDF documents. All files should be named using the following format: TUMURFP 2\_[Document type]\_[Institution name]\_[Head principal investigator last name] (e.g., TUMURFP 2\_Budget narrative\_Columbia\_Smith).
